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Susan Ouriou is a literary translator, fiction writer, and conference interpreter with an M.A. in Translation Studies from the Sorbonne University in Paris, France. She works from French and Spanish into English. In 2009, she won Canada's Governor General's Award for Literary Translation (as well as three short-listings in other years) and was awarded the insignia of Chevalier in France's Ordre des Arts et des Lettres in 2012. She helped found the Banff International Literary Translation Centre residency and has served as a member of its advisory council, as a consulting translator and as its director. She has also worked as faculty for The Banff Centre's Aboriginal Emerging Writers residency. Susan is the editor of the 2010 anthology *Beyond Words – Translating the World* and the 2014 anthology *Languages of Our World - Indigenous Poems and Stories from Quebec (Langues de notre monde - Poèmes et récits autochtones du Québec*). She is also the author of two novels, *Damselfish* and *Nathan,* as well as numerous short stories, some of which have been translated into French, Spanish, Dutch and Bulgarian.
